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



2. Personalized lessons: Students learn in different ways. Some soak up text like a sponge, while others best grasp a concept when they see it or get their hands on it.

Forsyth County Schools in Georgia is making this type of personalized learning the district standard thanks to what Mike Evans, the district's director of information and instructional support, refers to as a "recommendation engine."

The system assesses students' learning styles – visual, auditory or kinesthetic – and then suggests different resources for teachers to use on a given lesson to reach each type of learner.

While Forsyth has the financial resources for a districtwide system thanks to a federal grant, teachers can still approach personalized learning by incorporating online resources that appeal to a variety of learning styles. This could include Khan Academy videos or using Skype to bring researchers and experts into their classroom via video chat, Evans says.

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

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

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My thoughts on the first day of school...

My thoughts on the first day of school ...

I just returned from the MoACTE/MBEA summer conference. This conference is great and always gets me motivated to get back to school and get focused on the upcoming school year.

One session I attended was on dealing with disruptive students. The speaker, Chris, talked about many of Harry Wong's strategies on "the first days of school" and the importance of focusing on procedures. So, I thought I would share with you my first days plans and how I go about setting the tone for my classroom for day 1.

First, don't focus on RULES. Focus on PROCEDURES and EXPECTATIONS. Instead of saying, "Don't run into the room as the bell rings and race to your seat or you will be tardy" my expectation is that you should "Be in your seat, logged on to the computer, and at the class website starting on the bellringer when the bell rings." You can have fun with this...use the "how not" strategy and illustrate how NOT to do something. One example of that in my classroom is that I sit in a chair (I have rolling chairs) and I roll across the room to the pencil sharpener to sharpen my pencil. This is not appropriate in my room as they are to keep chairs at the desks. So, I make a big "song and dance" act to roll dramatically across the room and then ask what is wrong with that picture. Procedures can be a little boring. I do a "Following Directions Follies" activity I adapted that gets them thinking about some of my ways. See attachment to check that out. It's lots of fun.






Back channeling is a great way to get your students interacting without causing excessive distraction during a lecture or a movie. Here is a list of sites to get the students interacting.

• <u>Donut Chat</u> – A fantastic site for creating an easy to use chat room. The user has the ability to filter words, manage multiple rooms, and even embed it into their site! This site give the teacher great control.

- <u>Neat Chat</u> A very easy to use site for creating simple chat rooms to be used as a back channel. Also, you can print out chats and upload files.
- <u>Chatzy</u> Create private chat rooms and invite users with emails. Includes some advanced features.
- BackNoise User friendly and easy to set up.
- <u>TodaysMeet</u> If you are use to the 140 Twitter limit this site is perfect for you.
- <u>TinyChat</u> The integration with twitter is a great tool.
- <u>Skrbl</u> A great interactive whiteboard where people have the ability to chat/text/draw all in the space place. Great for brainstorming!
