

Getting Started:

- Go to this link and put in your info:
 - http://www.fbla.org/main_interior.asp?module=coplink&cop=2
 - It's \$20 to charter a chapter and I'm sure that a seasoned chapter would be willing to pay this fee for you!
This is a ONE TIME FEE.
 - Must charter by October 1st
- Recruit Members! - You only need 2-3 members to charter a chapter.
 - Students must pay dues each year:
\$4 State + \$4 National + ?? Local



Then What?

- Incorporate FBLA into your class
 - Scavenger Hunt
 - FBLA State Projects
 - Competitive Events
- Scout out an Officer Team:
Let your students decide what extra stuff they would like to do!
 - School Service Projects
 - Community Service Projects
 - Social Activities



Competitions

- Region
 - Register in early December
 - Testing in late Dec or early January
 - Region Conferences in January
 - \$15 to take 2 tests OR
\$20 for testing AND conference
- State
 - Register in January
 - Testing in February
 - State Conference at the end of Feb.
 - \$45 – Includes 2 tests, lunch, conf, etc.



Competitions

- Students do NOT have to qualify at Region to go to State for MOST
- There are 4 types of Tests
 - Technical Submission
 - Usually submitted in early December for Region and end of January for State
 - Performance – Must Qualify at Region
 - Video Submission for Region
 - Actual Performance for State
 - Skill Test – State Only
 - Online Test – Region and State

You can test Skill and Online on the same day for State.

You must have a proctor do your testing (ie: Media Specialist, TST, etc.)

Just Try It!!

- I promise you **WON'T** be disappointed!!
- Why? Because once you see the looks on the faces of your students when they win an award OR help someone in need (realize it's not all about **THEM**), I **PROMISE** it will **ALL** be worth it!!



What I Did in Year 1:

- Did NOT apply for extended day but got approval from my county and principal before starting
- Got an officer team together
- Ended up with more members than I anticipated – enticed them with HOT SIGN Krispy Kreme doughnuts – Some joined just for the doughnuts but that's OK!
- Went to all of the conferences by myself and observed



In Conclusion

- You do NOT have to do EVERY thing
- Do as much as you feel comfortable doing your first year just to figure out how things work – Incorporate as much as you can into your curriculum!!
- If you are going to apply for extended day, make sure you know your CTAE director's expectations up front
- Make sure you are not doing all of the work!! Your Officer Team should do as much as possible!!
- I always make sure that I remember that this is a "student-led" organization and introduce the idea of "servant leadership" to my officers


